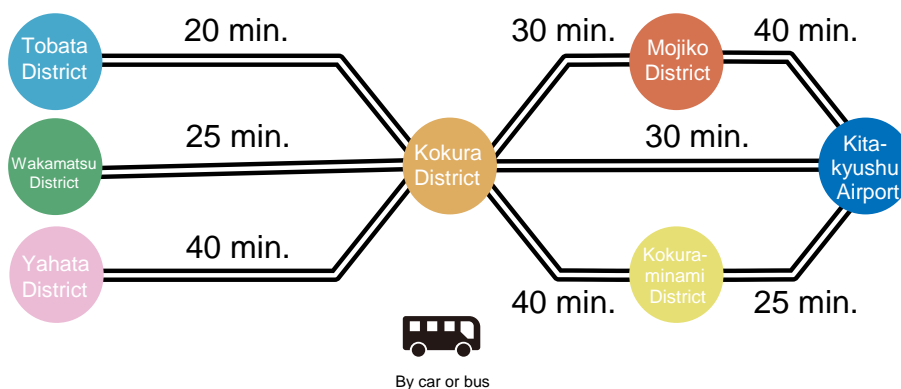
Map of Kyushu

Kokura Castle



The castle keep of Kokura Castle was built by Tadaoki Hosokawa, a military commander who lived in the Sengoku period to the early Edo period. Distinguished by the “karazukuri” architectural style, there are no roof eaves between the 4th and 5th floors, and the 5th floor is larger than the 4th. In addition, the castle’s stone masonry was constructed without hewn stones. Instead, stones were brought from Mt. Adachi and piled atop one another in their natural shape. The castle keep was renovated in 2019 and is now available as a party venue.

The Fukuoka area, including Kokura Castle, is the only area in Japan to have been selected by CNN Travel as one of the “19 best places to visit in 2019.” A photo of Kokura Castle was featured at the top of the article.

Kokura Castle Japanese Garden



This is the restored daimyo villa of the Ogasawara family, who succeeded the Hosokawa family that built Kokura Castle. It recreates a daimyo garden and the typical “shoin-style” of samurai residences in what was once the Ogasawara’s second home.

The Japanese garden offers the most picturesque view of Kokura Castle. You can even dine on kaiseki cuisine and other dishes while enjoying attractions such as a laser show that lights up the garden.

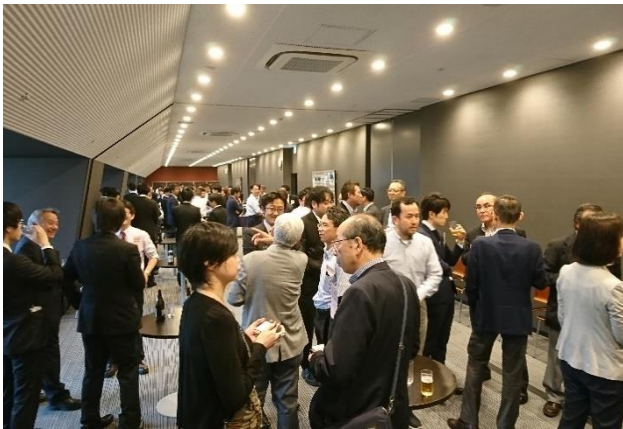

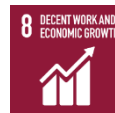
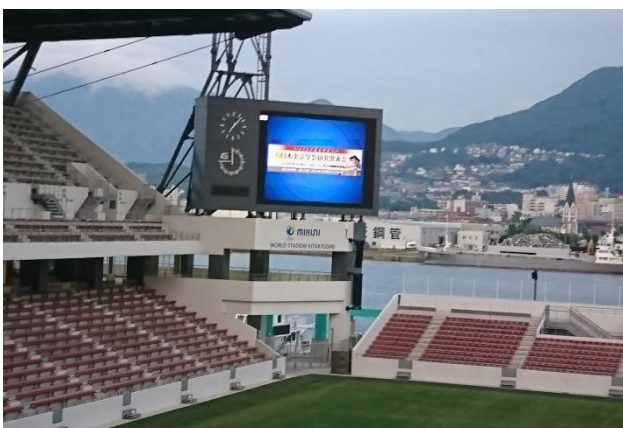
Mikuni World Stadium



This is the home stadium of Giravanz Kitakyushu, a team in the Japan Professional Football League (J.League). It stands next to Kitakyushu International Conference Center, which was designed by Arata Isozaki, an architect who won the Pritzker Prize, known as the Nobel Prize of architecture. Kanzanso Bekkan

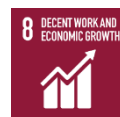


This long-established Japanese-style restaurant housed in a “sukiya-style” building encloses one of the best Japanese gardens in Kitakyushu.

Former Moji Mitsui Club



This was built as a social club for the Moji Branch of Mitsui & Co., Ltd. in 1921 in Tanimachi, Moji-ku. The following year, Albert Einstein and his wife stayed overnight when visiting Japan for a lecture. The building features the half-timber style of traditional European wooden construction with modern art-deco design incorporated into the interior. It was designated a national important cultural property in March 1990. Banquets can be held in the reception hall and rooms with a view of the sea. In addition, the first-floor multipurpose space can be utilized for music events such as concerts, exhibits, and other events. There is also a piano.

*The building will be closed for preservation/repair work and earthquake proofing April 1, 2022–March 2023 (scheduled); the restaurant will remain open.

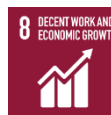

Marrygold Mojiko Geihinkan

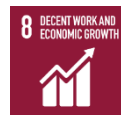


This renovated building was once the Moji Branch of Fukuoka Bank, constructed in 1950. Though it's currently used primarily as a wedding hall, it's also available for banquets and parties. It serves French cuisine prepared from seasonal ingredients and fresh fish from Kanmon. The menu is created based on the purpose of the party and the guest composition. Optional services that add color to a party, such as live jazz music, are also available.

Former Mitsui O. S. K. Line



The building was constructed in 1917 as the Moji Branch of O.S.K. Lines, Ltd., a shipping company established in 1884. It is a nationally registered tangible cultural property. At the time of its construction, as many as 60 passenger ships sailed from Moji Port to Taiwan, China, India, and Europe in a single month. The Mitsui O. S. K. Line Bldg. was a ship hub, with the first floor used as a waiting room and the second floor as offices. It was once busy with people excitedly departing for foreign lands. Today, the first floor houses the Watase Seizo Gallery and other facilities, and the second floor is a multipurpose space called Kaikyo Roman Hall.

Former Dalian Sea Route Warehouse



This building was constructed in 1929 as Moji Customs Terminal 1 and was used for international passengers. It was designed by Yoshikuni Okuma, an architect who also worked on the National Diet Building. Currently, a film and performing arts museum called the Matsunaga Archives is on the first floor, while the second floor has a hall that can be used for showing movies, holding musical performances, or other events.

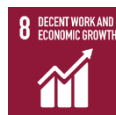

Former Moji Customs Bldg.



Moji Customs was established in 1909, and the Former Moji Customs Bldg. was constructed in 1912 as a two-story brick structure with a tiled roof. It was used as a customs building until the early Showa period. In 1994, the City of Kitakyushu placed a special order for red bricks and restored the building. The spacious first floor features an atrium and has a rest area, coffee shop, and exhibit room with permanent displays on Moji Customs. The second floor can be used for exhibitions and other events.

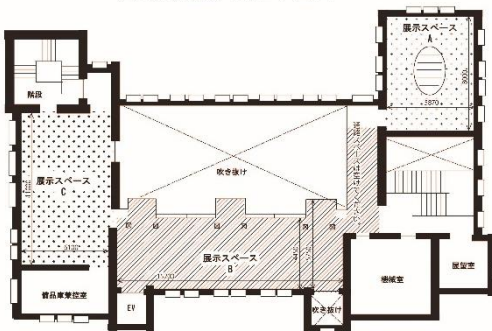

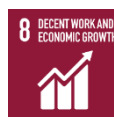

Dalian Friendship Memorial



This is a replica of the Chinese Eastern Railway Office built by the Russian Empire in China (Dalian) in 1902. It was constructed to commemorate the 15th anniversary of the friendship agreement made between the cities of Dalian and Kitakyushu.

Dalian Acacia (a Chinese restaurant) is on the first floor, and the Mojiko Retro Exchange Space on the second floor can be used as a unique avenue from 6:00 pm after the facility closes.



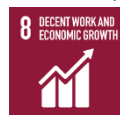

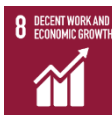

Sola Land Hiraodai (Hiraodai Countryside Park)



Hiraodai, one of the three major karst formations in Japan, has been designated a natural monument and quasi-national park. Hiraodai Countryside Park is located on the karst plateau, which is unusual for its rocks that resemble a flock of sheep. Here, you'll find a variety of playground equipment, sandpits, grass sledding, a hands-on workshop for making pottery, Forest Camp Kokura that offers glamping, and a campsite.

Furukawa Mining expanded into Wakamatsu to develop its coal business in the Chikuho region. This two-story office building was constructed in 1919 as the Wakamatsu Branch Office.

Ryotei Kinnabe (Japanese-style restaurant)



This historical Japanese-style restaurant was established in 1895. The original building burned down. The building standing today was constructed between the late Meiji period and early Taisho period and is still used as a Japanese-style restaurant. The solemn black plaster exterior of the main building and round timber used in the front gate speak to the prosperity of Wakamatsu back when it was reconstructed. The building has also become a valuable asset in a community that is losing its historical townscape. The main building and front gate are nationally registered tangible cultural properties.

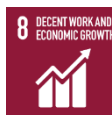

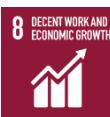

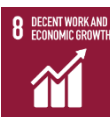

Former Matsumoto Residence (The Industry Club of West Japan)



The Western-style building was designed by Kingo Tatsuno, the architect who designed Tokyo Station and the head office of the Bank of Japan. This is a typical residence from the Meiji era for a person of noble rank, and has been designated a national important cultural property. It was home to one of the founders of the Kyushu Institute of Technology, Kenjiro Matsumoto (the second son of Keiichiro Yasukawa, founder of Yaskawa Electric Corporation). The residence was used by the Matsumoto family until World War II, but was seized by the U.S. military after the war. Later, the residence was taken over by the Industry Club of West Japan when the association of Kitakyushu business leaders was formed. At present, it's only opened to the public once a year and its use is limited to events such as weddings and dinners.

Former Residence of Yasukawa



This was the residence of Keiichiro Yasukawa who was an entrepreneur that built the foundation of the industrial City of Kitakyushu. He operated a series of coal-related companies during the Meiji period and helped bring the Imperial Steel Works to the city. It has been designated a tangible cultural property by the City of Kitakyushu. Keiichiro Yasukawa served as president of Meiji Mining Company and established a limited partnership, Yaskawa Electric (now Yaskawa Electric Corporation), in 1915 with his third son, Seizaburo and fifth son, Daigoro. In addition, aiming for an “educational utopia,” he invested a considerable amount of his own money to establish the Meiji College of Technology (now Kyushu Institute of Technology) and its affiliated elementary school (now Meiji Gakuen) for the purpose of developing social and public welfare. The Yasukawa family had interactions with Sun Yat-sen, and a commemorative photo was taken at this residence when the leader and his associates came to visit in 1913. When you visit the residence today, you can look out at the beautiful garden while enjoying Japanese tea and sweets. General public admission began in earnest in April this year, and the residence may be made available as a unique venue in the future.

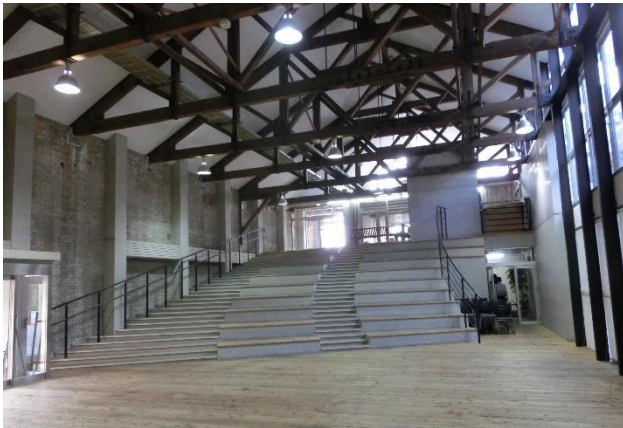

Imperial Beer was established on this site in 1912 and began brewing the following year. The company entered the beer industry with the release of Sakura Beer. Since then, the company name has changed from Sakura Beer to Dainippon Beer, Nippon Beer, and Sapporo Beer, and the Sapporo Beer Kyushu Factory continued to support Moji's industry until 2000. The Red Brick Exchange Center is one of several buildings that still remain at Moji Red Brick Place where the factory once stood. It has since become a place for community interaction as a hall available for rent. It is a nationally registered tangible cultural property.

Kitakyushu Urban Monorail

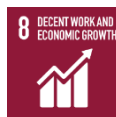


The Kitakyushu Urban Monorail spans 8.8 km and connects Kokura Station, the gateway to the City of Kitakyushu, to Kikugaoka Station in Kokuraminami-ku. The monorail cars can be exclusively reserved for a roundtrip of approximately one hour. You can bring your own boxed lunches and have a party.

This new museum was established in 2022 on the site where the Kokura Army Arsenal once existed with the belief that the tragedy of war must not be forgotten, especially now that over 70 years have passed since WWII ended and most people today have never lived or experienced the miseries of war. War materials and everyday items donated by residents have been utilized to recreate the wartime damage suffered by the five cities that existed prior to merging into the City of Kitakyushu. Visitors are encouraged to reflect on the tragedy of war, the importance of peace, and the preciousness of life through the “Memories” exhibit which shows the vibrant prewar lifestyle that was lost due to the war by utilizing the latest video and sound technologies, such as projection mapping and a 360° theater.

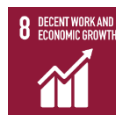

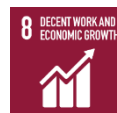

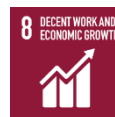

This museum recreates the railway station setting through the main building, which retains the red-brick architecture from when it was built in 1891 as the headquarters for the Kyushu Railway Company, and a display of passenger cars that were in service during that same period. It introduces the joy of traveling on the railroad through the history of railway development in Kyushu, a Driving Simulator for experiencing how it feels to operate a train, and a large panoramic display of Kyushu Railway. 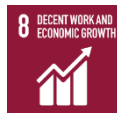

The ingredients used to make the beer include discarded bread crusts from bread made by Crown Baking Co., Ltd., which is known for providing bread to school lunches in Kitakyushu. Wheat malt flour comprises over 50% of the ingredients in “Weizen” Mojiko Beer, and these bread crusts are used in place of the wheat malt flour, making up about 10% of “Bread Weizen” beer.

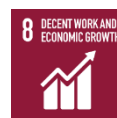

These bamboo incense sticks are made from the moso bamboo used in the Kokura Castle Takeakari Festival.* The container is made from Japanese timber bamboo. The incense has the distinctive aroma of refreshing green bamboo. After being emptied, the bamboo container can be repurposed as a pen holder or some other function.

With the cooperation of the Kokura Castle Takeakari Planning Committee, the incense is manufactured and sold by Nogami Shinbutsugu-ten (a shop selling Shinto and Buddhist items) in the City of Kitakyushu.

The event aims to turn overgrown bamboo that invades surrounding vegetation into something of value. Bamboo from such mountain groves is cut down, made into bamboo lanterns with help from residents, and lit up at Kokura Castle every fall to create an enchanting spectacle.

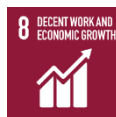

Bamboo Charcoal Blend Coffee and Sweets



Bamboo Charcoal Blend Coffee is a unique blended coffee made from fair trade coffee cultivated without pesticides and chemical fertilizers, and “Take Summy,” an edible bamboo charcoal powder developed by students at the local Kokura Commercial High School from bamboo that is disposed of in large quantities when bamboo groves in the city are trimmed. It is produced at BOCCHI, a welfare service business for people with disabilities that is located in the city, in collaboration with Chikurin Kyoshin, a group that makes bamboo instruments and holds musical performances using bamboo instruments. BOCCHI also makes sweets such as Bamboo Charcoal Coffee Cookies and Sake Lees Sticks made using sake lees from Mizokamishuzo, a local sake brewery.

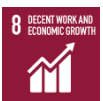

Goheita Bayashi

Goheita Bayashi is said to have originated with the kawahirata boatmen who, in between their strenuous work, would hum popular songs and folk tunes while tapping the edge of the boat.

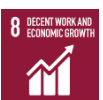


Jazz performances

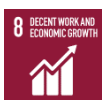

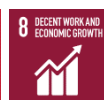
Koto and shakuhachi
